Skills targeted General learning objectives	<p>This module allows students to assimilate the fundamentals of digital design through the analysis of screen-based cultures, the structuring of coherent interface systems and the mastery of professional User Interface (UI) practices.</p> <p>Targeted skills include developing a critical understanding of how digital culture and aesthetics are shaped by screen-based media, using professional prototyping tools to build and iterate interface designs efficiently, and translating theoretical and technical skills into a complete, high-fidelity UI project aligned with industry standards.</p>		
Teaching content and form	<p>The module consists of two courses and a project based work.</p> <p>a) Screen Grammar: course on the fundamentals of digital culture and design, examining how screens shape contemporary interactions, communication, and aesthetics.</p> <p>b) Macro UI: introduction to User Interface (UI) design fundamentals and the professional use of rapid interface prototyping tools.</p> <p>c) Pixel Perfect: project based work focused on the detailed reinterpretation of an advanced digital interface, combining design system analysis with graphic precision, based on the material taught in the Screen Grammar and Macro UI units.</p>		
Forms of assessment and validation	<p>At the end of the semester, the works produced in unit c) are evaluated by a jury made up of the professors from the MA DXD program.</p> <p>The units a) and b) are not subject to grading. They remain mandatory, however, and active participation by students is expected.</p> <p>The assessment may take students' regular attendance at classes and lectures into account.</p> <p>To obtain credits, students must obtain an average mark of at least 4.</p>		
Remedial teaching	<p>Remediation is possible by working to make good observed shortfalls.</p> <p>Module repeated in the academic year following a fail mark, according to procedures to be agreed with the director of the module.</p> <p>No remediation possible after repeating the module.</p>
