Skills targeted General learning objectives	The module aims to provide participants with the tools to improve soft communication and teams collaborations. Participants develop the skills needed to organise and lead work teams, thereby improving overall performance through the development of rational thinking. The module also emphasises the importance of successful collaboration with teams, focusing on the integral components of effective leadership, e.g. leadership style, soft-communication, feedback, decision-making, and conflict resolution.		
Teaching content and form	The <i>Creative collaboration and leadership</i> module offers a varied approach that combines theoretical concepts with case studies, practical exercises, and collaborative activities to increase effectiveness and confidence. Using methods that promote personal leadership and the management of interpersonal relationships, from vision to project execution, participants acquire skills that will enable them to excel in collaborative dynamics and develop a sustainable growth strategy for their business.		
Forms of assessment and validation	At the end of the module, participants submit a personal essay, in French or English, focusing on the application in their own practice of the skills and knowledge acquired during the course. The work is discussed in advance with the head professor. Personal work must be assessed as "passed" in order to obtain credits. Participation on at least 80% of the courses is also required.		
Remedial teaching	Remediation is possible, according to terms to be defined with the head of the module. No repetition is allowed after remediating the module.
